BILD's 2010 International Research and Practice Conference

This International Research and Practice Conference will be the 10th annual behaviour support event hosted by the British Institute of Learning Disability (BILD). These events have traditionally focused on best practice in the use of physical interventions, and the drive to create and further raise standards in training and practice has often led to constructive debate on a range of controversial issues such as mechanical restraint, seclusion and the use of chemical restraint.

Three years ago because of the change in the focus of our work, we changed the title from 'physical intervention conference' to 'positive behaviour support event'. Ever since, BILD has underscored this move by developing new publications and events promoting more positive and preventative approaches to supporting people and identifying how we can reduce the use of restrictive practices.

Last year's conference in York saw the launch of the BILD Positive Behaviour Support Mission, which identifies how we are promoting a positive human rights approach to the support of people who might challenge services. The mission can be seen at www.bild.org.uk/behavioursupport.

This International Research event will be an opportunity for delegates to hear from respected researchers, dynamic international speakers and innovators of practice in the field of positive behaviour support and intellectual disability.

The event will balance research and practice with a range of speakers and practice based workshops. Using an established and successful format, this will be a great opportunity to hear from acknowledged experts in the field and to gain a wealth of knowledge, engage in debate and exchange new ideas over two busy days.

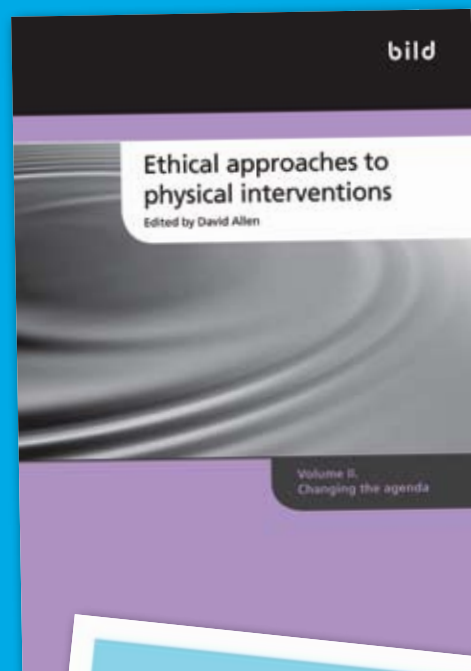
